All examination registration fees are paid by the school. This is an encouragement to the students, and it also lets the students know that learning Chinese every Friday is not a "waste of time". Instead, it is to enrich their Chinese knowledge and be able to present this as a strength to the community, and for their future. The next exam is scheduled in term 2, 2023.



We have had a very busy term, learning a lot of wonderful new vocabulary for some common topics and new songs. All students have worked hard in class to practise and develop their language abilities. They have all shown a great interest in learning Chinese.

This term we learnt how to get ready for our imaginary trip to overseas, asking and answering questions about directions, describing famous attractions and learning to describe uses of different types of transport.

During our classes, we also engaged in many class activities to assist with language learning, which included using audio-visual resources, such as YouTube video clips. The clips are very useful because students can continue watching them at home. We also played games to support vocabulary development, such as role-plays, and fishing game. Activities such as these help students practice speaking and listening, and also provide a great way to review what we learn in the class.

I'm pleased to see that all students participated very actively in the class activities and made good attempts to complete all the worksheet exercises.

The main topic of this term is "travel and holiday". We have covered a number of sub-topics combined with the theme such as "passport", "transportation", "clothes" and "attractions".

The class notes (PPT slides) were emailed to parents weekly. I strongly encourage students to complete assigned homework and/or task as indicated. All they need is 10 minutes per day to review the words and sentences grammar learnt in class.

Quiz paper and student's homework will be taken home today. I hope all students can review and practice the characters learnt during this holiday.

High School ∼ Ms. Tan

It has been a wonderful experience meeting the old and new faces alike when I took over the high school class in term 4. I'm thankful for the opportunity to be able to get to know the few old students all over again, and to work along with the new students in the final term of the year. I'm also glad to see that Tia, who joined the high school class for the first time, has quickly adjusted to the new class environment, and showing good progress despite the steep learning curve transitioning from Stage 3 to Stage 4.

The theme for this term is 'Travel and holiday'. We have covered a number of topics associated with the theme such as 'passport', 'countries and cities', 'transportation', 'weather and seasons' and 'popular tourist attractions in China'. Besides content knowledge acquisition like vocabulary, grammar points and interrogative statements, students were also strongly encouraged to develop relevant skills which promoted independent learning. Students, for example, learnt how to decipher the meaning of a character using contextual or visual clues since a character may carry several meanings. Students also had ample opportunities to make use of learning tools such as the Pleco Chinese-English dictionary app or Google translate to look up the meaning or pronunciation of new Chinese words when they were completing the reading comprehension or role-play activities.

Students' listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills were honed through a variety of language practice tasks and activities such as Questions & Answers (Q&A) speaking tasks, online games, YouTube video clips, oral presentations, online flashcards, as well as print and online worksheets.

The class notes (PPT slides containing the vocabulary words and grammar points for the week's lesson topic) were sent to parents via email on a weekly basis. I like to encourage students to regularly review the Chinese words and expressions they learnt in class whenever they have time so that they can commit what they have learnt to their long-term memory.

Finally, I wish you all a safe and joyful holiday! Hope to see you all again in 2023!

I like to congratulate all the students for their excellent work during the year, especially those who have put great effort into preparing for their HSK examinations and achieved outstanding results.

This term began with lessons on describing travel plans and arranging holiday bookings. Then students learnt to describe what to pack for an overseas trip, answer airport security questions, and describe travel advice and information. Students learnt to talk about tourism information from travel advertisements.

As this is a mother tongue class, the teacher and students speak only Chinese. Although our students are of different ages, they understand the teacher's instructions and can exchange main ideas to reach communication goals. This group's primary focus is reading and writing characters, as speaking and listening skills are their strengths. Students are encouraged to read books in Chinese and watch films with Chinese subtitles during the holiday, which will help them improve their language skills.
